



Peter and Penny Auditions for Robin Hood at Rotherham Civic Theatre Saturday 20th July 2024

Registration will take place from 9.30am – 10am in the Civic Theatre foyer.

Audition Day Information

- Children must be accompanied by a parent or guardian for the duration of the auditions and designated waiting areas will be appointed.
- The Victoria Theatre and Imagine Theatre Ltd cannot be held responsible for any child not accompanied by a responsible adult while at the auditions.
- Children must be at least 9 years old and in year 4 of school on the first day of rehearsals and no older than 16 and in year 11 on the last day of the performances.

Audition Guidelines

- Please wear comfortable clothing and suitable shoes (ideally jazz, soft dance trainers or ballet shoes please. Heavy Dance trainers, outdoor trainers, boots or shoes are not suitable as we cannot see the child's footwork properly in these styles of footwear.)
- Avoid shiny leotards if possible as the identification stickers tend to fall off these.
- Please tie long hair back, ideally in a bun.
- Make sure your child has a soft drink with them (not fizzy) and slow energy release foods such as pasta, chicken, yoghurts, bananas, jacket potato etc. for snacks and lunch.
- Should your child be asthmatic, have allergies or any other condition which may require medication, please ensure they have this with them. Please do let us know when registering the auditionee if you have any concerns.

Peter and Penny Auditions Only

Please note, these auditions will focus on singing, dancing, and acting. The registration form for these roles must be emailed to imagine prior to the auditions.

Before the auditions

We will be auditioning children to play Peter and Penny, which are male and female identifying roles. Those auditioning must register with us in advance. Please download and complete the Peter and Penny Audition form and send it to us (Details of how to do this are on the Audition Form) to register. Two weeks before the audition we will forward all the auditionees an excerpt of the script to practice before the audition.

How the audition day works

Once the onsite registration has taken place all auditionees and families will be briefed on the process of the day.

The auditionees will then all be taken into the audition room together and worked through a process of script work, singing and a slight movement call.

The onsite team will work with the auditionee's, pairing them up with other auditionees to work on the Peter and Penny Look.

There will be a one-hour lunch – the time will be determined on the day. If your child has been recalled please ensure they are back at the venue by their designated recall time.

- All children will be auditioned in the morning. Those who are successful will be recalled in the afternoon session. Those who are unsuccessful will be allowed to go home.
- Children recalled for the afternoon session will remain in the room until the final cast are announced unless you are otherwise advised on the day.

Those children chosen to play Peter and Penny, and their parents will be asked to stay after the audition sessions for a chat about licensing and panto guidelines.

What we are looking for

We are looking for 4 Peter and Penny's— one to perform with each Junior Ensemble team. We are also looking for a reserve Peter and Penny to perform in the Junior Ensemble, but who may be asked to take on the role of Peter or Penny if the main child can no longer do the show or is ill for a performance. All children will be given some paperwork at the end of the auditions, stating which team they are in and the roles they have been offered where relevant.

Throughout the day, the audition panel will be looking for able performers who show capability in terms of dancing, singing and performance ability, enthusiasm and ability to follow instructions.

If successful, what happens next?

Once we have decided upon our final Junior Ensemble, those that are remaining will be split into 'main team' and 'reserve team' members. They will then be given some paperwork stating which team they're in.

To perform in the pantomime all children must be granted a **performance licence**. A performance licence is a legal document that all children should be granted through their local council.

- Imagine Theatre will email the application to parents which must be completed and returned by the deadline. Imagine Theatre will then submit the application to the relevant authority.
- Without a performance licence, a child will not be able to perform.

All children will be committed to rehearsals six days a week including weekend days and weekday evenings from Thursday 14th November. There will also be some daytime rehearsals during w/c 25th November (which does mean missing school). The show runs from 28th November 2024 – 5th January 2025 inclusive. There are 72 performances in the run, which will be split between the 4 teams. Your child **MUST** be available for the duration as no rehearsals or allocated performances can be missed. *

What impact will the pantomime have on school?

Some rehearsals and performances will be during school time and children must be educationally able to miss some schooling. The Performers Head Teacher will be required to authorise the absences required for performances as part of the licence application. If the Head Teacher will not authorise the absences, your child will be unable to perform.

We look forward to seeing you and your child at 9.30am on Saturday 20th July 2024 and remind them to bring their best smile with them!
